Child & Family Support Center Presentation – Hillary Anderson

Hillary passed out information from the Child & Family Support Center. April is Child Abuse Prevention month nationwide. Mayor Howlett assigned Mat to call Utah Local Governments Trust, who carries our liability insurance, on how much it costs.

Minutes

Bills

Fire Department Report

Troy reported the status of the grants that the department has applied for. The county received the grant for the radios. We will be receiving an invoice for our portion. Kyle asked Troy questions regarding the water system in the event of an emergency. The water on the tender will be used for life-saving only, not for putting out house fires. Mat suggested having a meeting where the Council & Fire Department would meet with the directors and block captains that each LDS ward has to go over the various emergency plans. Possible dates were discussed. It was decided that Sunday evening might be the best time. Mayor Howlett suggested that everyone on the Council read the Emergency Operations Plan that the Town has. It can be downloaded off the Town website.

Executive Session – Legal & Personnel

A motion was made by Mat to open the Executive Session for Legal and Personnel. Seconded by Kyle. All in favor. Executive session opens at 8:45 pm. Regular meeting restarts at 10:19 pm.

Council Reports

- **Roads** – Jay picked up the truck. He offered to take the truck to Hyrum Tire for an oil change and a new battery.
- **Water** – Bev gave Leland a list of delinquent customers and reminded him of the monthly reads. Leland reported that the water usage is up and asked members of the Council to be on the look out for possible leaks.
- **Community** – Bev will include information on the Youth Council on a ½ sheet flyer with the water bill. Mat reported on his training meeting of the County Citizen Planner. They discussed Public Meetings. One thing he learned was that all of our ordinances should have a severability clause. Mat reminded everyone about daylight savings time. The next council meeting will begin at 7:30 pm.

- Leland showed the Council the RAPZ application that he turned into Lynn Lemon. The County will be making their decision in May.

A motion was made by Jay to adjourn. Seconded by Mat. All in favor. Meeting closes at 10:20 pm.
