Council Members Present- Mayor Atwood, Vic Little, Martell Lowe, Shannon Rasmussen

Community Members Present- Karina Brown, Randall Rees, Dorothy and Samuel Peel, Fire Chief Troy Fredrickson

Samuel Peel asked for a few minutes at the beginning of the meeting to explain what he would like to do for an Eagle Scout Project and to get the Council's approval for the project. He would like to replace the swing set at the old park by the Town Hall with a new swing set. One verbal bid he received came in close to 5000.00. The Council approved the idea, but would like to see some additional bids. Alyssa will get some additional bids.

Minutes- The Minutes of June 20, 2018 were emailed to the Council Members previous to the meeting. Vic asked that clarification be added to explain what the "PTIF" accounts were. Vic made a motion to approve the minutes of June 20, 2018; Martell seconded that motion, all in favor.

Bills- Vic read the bills. Vic made a motion to approve the bills as read; Shannon seconded that motion, all in favor.

Public Comment- None at this time.

Department Expenditures- The Fire Department would like to purchase some equipment necessary to send the brush truck out to fight fires. They had a bid from Weidner fire and a bid from L.N. Curtis. The Weidner bid was high, but L.N. Curtis was lower and who they were going to use to purchase the equipment. The Council asked for some clarification on what they were purchasing from where. Troy was able to fill out a purchase request and provide that clarification. Vic made a motion to approve spending up to 2666.37 on the equipment requested. Shannon seconded that motion, all in favor.

Peggy Nath turned in a request for Heidi Horger to attend a conference in Hurricane Utah the 25th of July. She also included a request for per diem pay for Heidi. The Council would like to see exactly what this Conference is for and if there are any closer that may save money on travel and food etc.

Karina Brown- Democratic Candidate UT House District 5- Karina Brown attended the meeting to introduce herself and to better understand the different concerns Towns and Cities have throughout the District.

Josh Sutton- Community Concerns- Josh did not attend the meeting. Mayor Atwood explained that there was some concern with dirt bikes going too fast down 300 west. He has discussed this with the Sheriff's department multiple times and also has talked to as many of the kids with dirt bikes in town as he could. He feels like with those steps, the problem should subside.

Resolution 2018-02- Cache County Garbage Rates- Cache County has had to raise the garbage rates, therefore the Town had to raise our rates to keep up with the rate change at the County. Mayor Atwood explained that the Resolution would raise our current rates by \$2.00. He asked for a roll call vote to approve this change and adopt this resolution:

Subdivision Ordinance Review – The Planning Commission looked through the Subdivision Ordinances and found one spot that specified that if a road was already owned by the Town the Developer would only have to develop one-half of the roads. They suggested removing the words “one-half” and the Ordinance would then read that the Developer would be required to totally fund the cost of any road construction, whether the right-of-way be owned by the Town or by a landowner.

Council Reports

- **Roads- Martell Lowe-** Martell has noticed some intersection have trees causing visibility issues. He will make a list of the intersections that are the worst and arrange tree trimming for those intersections.
- **Water- Vic Little-** Mayor Atwood reported that the spring flow is slowing down and the pumps will need to be turned on shortly. There was some discussion on what running the pumps would entail and what needed to be done in order to get them on.
- **Community-Shannon Rasmussen-** Shannon reported that the Youth Council would be meeting Friday June 12 at the Town Hall. She wanted to get ice cream for the Youth Council's meeting and wondered about ordering T-Shirts for the Youth Council. The Council thought this was a good idea and suggested she get an idea of what design they would want and then we can get a bid for T-shirts.
- **Fire/Grants/Budget-** Nothing at this time.

Unfinished Business-

There were two clearance requests from the Planning and Zoning meeting held June 28, 2018. One was for Jesse Sharp (8840 S. 100 E.) to use a shipping container as a shed in his back yard, and another was for the Moultries (8820 S. 200 W.) to move a shed from the front yard to the backyard. Shannon made a motion to approve Jesse Sharps storage container, Martell seconded that motion, all in favor. Shannon made a motion to approve the shed for the Moultries, Martell seconded that motion, all in favor.

New Business- None at this time.

Adjourn- Vic made a motion to adjourn; Shannon seconded that motion, all in favor.
