Council Members Present- Mayor Atwood, Vic Little, Martell Lowe, Shannon Rasmussen, Larry Johnson, Alyssa Petersen (Recorder)

Community Members Present- Devin and Tricia Thomas, Blake Pulsipher

Minutes- The Minutes of August 21, 2019 were emailed to all the Council members previous to the meeting. Vic made a motion to accept the Minutes as amended; Larry seconded that motion, all in favor.

Bills- Martell read the bills. There were a few questions on the bills. Larry made a motion to approve the bills as read, Martell seconded that motion.

Public Comment- None at this time.

Paradise Cemetery- Maintenance Shed Power- Mayor Atwood has talked to Rocky Mountain Power, and Ryan Ohlwiler. Rocky Mountain power wants to know what the shed will be used for and how much of a load will be required. Ryan Ohlwiler is working on a bid. The Cemetery is working on the irrigation valve at the cemetery now.

Planning and Zoning

- **Devin Thomas- Shop-9020 S. 300 W.** – The Thomas’s attended the Planning Commission meeting held August 22, 2019. They are building a metal 30 x 40 shop, with a height of 15’6.” They turned in all the required paperwork. The Planning Commission approved the Zoning Clearance form. Vic made a motion to approve the shop; Martell seconded that motion, all in favor.
- **Mike Forbes- Shed & Greenhouse- 65 W. 9000 S.-** The Forbes attended the Planning and Zoning meeting held August 22, 2019. The Planning Commission approved the shed and the greenhouse Zoning Clearance. Shannon made a motion to approve the shed and greenhouse, Larry seconded that motion, all in favor.

Council Reports

- **Roads - Martell Lowe** – Nothing at this time.
- **Water- Vic Little-** Vic wondered about implementing some kind of a hydrant testing program. He wondered if he should reach out to Rural Water or what the standard operating procedure was for testing the hydrants. Mayor Atwood agreed with that and suggested that they have 3 of them do the testing.
- **Community- Shannon Rasmussen-** Shannon reported that Trout and Berry days went well. Mayor Atwood wondered about a fun end-of-year activity for the Youth Council. They put a lot of effort into a variety of events all summer. A local resident works with Youth Councils and is getting information for Shannon about classes at USU specifically for Youth Councils about writing resumes, etc.

The Youth Council would like to host a dinner for the over-80-year-old crowd in Paradise at the Town Hall. Shannon encouraged everyone on the Council to get a history booklet that the DUP ladies put together for Trout and Berry days.

- **Fire/Grants/Budget- Larry Johnson-** T&B Breakfast made \$2,856.00, they served 197 adults 57 kids, sold 283 quilt tickets, netted \$239.00 on quilt tickets. There was a discussion on new hires and the paperwork that needs to be turned in to the Office. Larry talked to Troy about getting another bid in with his purchase request and to get W4's and I9's turned in for new hires. Mayor Atwood went over the Fire Departments Standard Operating Procedures and reviewed who can drive the emergency vehicles. The Standard Operating Procedures call for 5 years' experience before you can drive one of the emergency vehicles.

Fire Department- Purchase Request/Turn-outs- The Council had a question on the turn-outs and how many people need wildland gear and turn-outs and who is new and whose gear is worn out.

Unfinished Business-

Mayor Atwood ordered stop signs. Mayor Atwood got a quote for metal partitions and grab bars and installation for under \$3000.00. He has to finalize the color and then will get them coming. He called the salesman today, but the salesman had left for the day. The Council would like to see some landscaping get done and the bleachers ordered. The partitions should get ordered tomorrow.

There was a discussion on bleachers and if they should be elevated or if they should sit on a cement pad on the ground. The Mayor thinks that once the bleachers arrive, an Eagle Scout Project could be assembling them. There was discussion on maintaining the arena.

Vic wondered about the Food Truck Friday that is planned for this Friday the 6th. It is still planned for this Friday and there will be two trucks at the Town Square from 6 to 9 p.m. They will be BBQ and Pauni Island Grill.

Vic wanted to make sure "Thank you" notes were sent out for the Trout and Berry Days auction. Mayor Atwood and Alyssa reported that "Thank You" letters had been sent to a variety of people/businesses that were part of Trout and Berry Days.

Shannon would like to see some letters sent to other properties in Town that need to clean up their personal properties.

New Business-

A request from Balls Brothers Escrow account was signed by Vic and the Mayor. Alyssa will send it to Ray's title company tomorrow. Vic had a few questions on the invoices that need to be paid from that escrow account.

Meeting Adjourns – Shannon made a motion to adjourn, Larry seconded that motion; meeting adjourns at 9:12 p.m.
