Council Members Present: Mayor Vic Little, Larry Johnson (present electronically via zoom), Shannon Rasmussen, Jason Winn

Excused: Trent Passey

Community Members Present: David Curtis (Cemetery District President)

Minutes - The Minutes of July 1, 2020 were emailed to the Council members previous to the meeting. Larry asked that the Minutes reflect that the Cemetery water valve is an Irrigation water valve. Alyssa will make that change. Jason made a motion to approve the Minutes of July 1, 2020 as amended, Shannon seconded that motion, all in favor.

Bills- Larry read the bills. Shannon made a motion to approve the bills as read, Jason seconded that motion, all in favor.

Public Comment- No public comment at this time.

Cemetery Irrigation Phase 1- David Curtis addressed the Council concerning the Irrigation system at the cemetery. The Council reviewed a proposal submitted to the Council in March of 2018. David submitted a bid from Valley Implement for \$7,726.18 for an isolation valve and phase one of the irrigation system. If approved, this would start the process of installing and isolating the cemetery irrigation line. The Irrigation system would be split into 4 different sections/phases. The Cemetery District would like to put in an underground system with an automated irrigation system to cut down on labor costs. At the time the bid was received in September of 2017, the Circle B Irrigation bid was more expensive than Valley Implement. The Council agreed with seeing an updated bid from Valley Implement only.

Unfinished Business-

Fire Station Bay Doors - Jason wondered if there was still the option of fixing the motors and trim on the bay doors. Mayor Little reported he is still working on it.

Green Waste- Jason was curious about why the Green Waste container came back. Jason and Shannon felt like the Council voted that the Green Waste should be discontinued if the County was going to be charging for it.

Playground- Jason and Shannon wondered about ordering the playground as soon as possible. Mayor Little will find out how far out the playground supplier is and get it ordered as soon as possible. There was a discussion on what projects need to be done first. The Council would like to see the parking lot cleaned up and possibly some asphalt as soon as possible. All the Council members have received complaints on the park and people hoping to see some progress. Mayor Little reported that Bruce Smith is currently building a retaining wall by the large pavilion.

Business Licenses- Jason asked about the Planning Commission looking at the revisions necessary for the Business License Ordinance. After the Public meeting that

was well-attended concerning businesses in Town he felt the Council needed to follow through on making sure the Planning Commission addressed that.

Tractor- The Town tractor is being repaired now. There were some additional repairs that needed to be done on the tractor. The repairs are still expected to be finished by the end of the week.

Non-Compliant Property- Larry wondered about the court date for the non-compliant property. It is not until next week.

New Business- No new business at this time.

Council Reports

- **Roads-Trent Passey** - Trent was not present. Nothing at this time.
- **Water-Larry Johnson-** Larry reported that the vault for the master meter has not come in yet. He also reported that he is still working on finding all the valves around Town.
- **Community- Shannon Rasmussen-** Shannon wondered how the Trout and Berry Days meetings had gone. Mayor Little reported that a lot of activities had been removed throughout the day where it was not possible for Social Distancing. The parade will have an extended route to enable people to space out more. The breakfast, dinner, flag ceremony, 5K run, and Parade and Auction are still planned. There was discussion on how to best set up booths if they were still an option. The dinner will be take-out or to-go and people can eat in the park or take it home. There will be an online option for ticket sales, or Fred Summers will sell tickets. There will be 5 lines for dinner to enable social distancing. They are expecting approximately 800 people. The cooking will all be done outside.
- **Fire/Grants/Budget- Jason Winn-** Jason reported they are still waiting to hear on the grants they have applied for. Brush 90 made approximately \$1,600.00 for the Avon fire. The truck was on the Red Spur Fire up Blacksmith Fork Canyon, and is now down in Saint George fighting the Turkey Road Fire for approximately the next 14 days. Casey Snider and Jim Atkinson are on the Saint George Fire. There was discussion on the Fires and how that works. There was discussion on Firework Restrictions for the 24th of July. The County will enforce some firework restrictions in the unincorporated parts of the County. Jason did not see a lot of fireworks that worried him on the 4th. The Council members do not see a need to restrict fireworks. There will not be firework restrictions in Town for the 24th.
